Course Title: Principles of Christian Worldview

I. Course Description

The purpose of this course is to ground the student in a rigorous defense of the truth of the Christian faith. To this end, in this course we will study, discuss, and reflect upon the nature of apologetics, the biblical case for apologetics, the nature of truth and argumentation, the existence and nature of God, and the evidences supporting Christianity. These evidences will be of several types, including philosophical, historical, and scientific. We will also consider major objections to the Christian faith in light of these evidences.

II. Course Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

1. Relate the issues of the inerrancy and trustworthiness of Scripture to apologetics.
2. Defend the deity and resurrection of Jesus Christ against the claims of skeptics.
3. Defend the concept of absolute truth against the claims of epistemic relativists, including postmodernists.
4. Defend the exclusivity of Jesus Christ against pluralism and inclusivism.
5. Discuss the nature of the apologetic task and the biblical basis for apologetics.
6. Appraise the arguments for the existence of God through a critical response to challenges to Christian theism.
